next category (60% -70%) are near meeting the standard set by the Commission: 16 programs. Those in the bottom category are below Commission: 23 programs. This is an increase in 2 programs since the last reporting period which ended in May. The programs in the NREMT pass rates are enclosed in this report. These statistics are for courses ending between August 31, 2020 and August 31, .2021. standard; 45 programs. Unfortunately, we have more programs under 50% than over. Since the last reporting period there have been While we still have a way to go on the EMT program to get up to the National average, we are at or close to the National average at represents those training institutions whose graduates' average at least 70% after the first attempt which is the standard set by the the Advanced EMT and Paramedic levels. The EMT courses are broken down into three separate categories. The top category six (6) new training institutions opened. 1 in district 4, 1 in district 6, 3 in district 7, and 1 in district 9.

60 - 69% pass rate over the past 3 years. In the last 6 months we have visited 14 training institutions giving them support and advice as well as checking to see how they are implementing the skills portfolios into their training programs. Each new program gets a site visit We have implemented site visits to assist struggling programs. We are concentrating on visiting those programs who have between at with the EMS Training Coordinator and the appropriate District Manager.
