AGREED ORDER AND JOINT MOTION TO DISMISS

The parties respectfully request the petition for review of Order Number BU30147-080119, filed on August 5, 2019 by Julie Riley, be dismissed. In support of this request, the parties state the following:

- 1. On May 15, 2019, Respondent performed an inspection of Petitioner's facility and issued an inspection report order citing 4 code violations that were required to be corrected by Petitioner.
- 2. On August 1, 2019, Respondent issued Petitioner a \$250 civil penalty for failing to correct violation number 4 of the May 15, 2019 inspection report.
 - 3. On August 5, 2019, Petitioner filed their petition for review of the civil penalty.
- 4. On September 9, 2019, Respondent issued Petitioner another \$250 civil penalty for failing to correct violation number 4 of the May 15, 2019 inspection report.
- 5. On September 23, 2019, the parties were able to informally resolve this case and agreed to the following:

Respondent will waive the civil penalties issued on August 5, 2019 and September 9, 2019, if Petitioner obtains a construction design release (as required by violation number 4 of the May 15, 2019 inspection report order) by no later than November 1, 2019.

WHEREFORE, the parties respectfully request this matter be dismissed with prejudice.
