The arrow to the right of the result indicates if the MCE had a meaningful improvement or reduction in its rate from the prior year (+/- 2 percentage points).

If there is no arrow, then the change from the prior year was not meaningful.

There are no arrows for CareSource since the MCE's contract began in CY 2017 and this is their first HEDIS reporting year.

Each MCE is coded based on how its results compared to Medicaid health plans nationally.

- Below the 25th percentile nationally
- Above the 25th percentile but below the 50th percentile nationally
- Above the 50th percentile but below the 75th percentile nationally
- Above the 75th percentile but below the 90th percentile nationally
- Above the 90th percentile nationally
