

Motor Vehicle Accident Death Rates

From 2016-2018, motor vehicle accident death rates were at a higher rate in Indiana compared to the Unties States.






MVA deaths were the highest for those between the ages of 15-24 for all three years






Males are more than twice as likely to die from a motor vehicle accident compared to females






- White/Caucasian's account for over 85% of MVA deaths
- Black/African American's account for roughly 10%






Differentiating Motor Vehicle Accident Types




Comparison of Suicide Deaths




2020 Demographics (All Deaths)






2020 Demographics (Suicide Deaths) - Counts







