13	our relatively new CFO is being brought up to
14	speed on the trainings that she needs,
15	certifications that she needs. There's a ton
16	that goes into that, but everything is on par
17	there, so we're excited about that, and you guys
18	should have the financial report in front of you.
19	There's no issues there in terms of finances.
20	Everything is on par, so we are officially good
21	to go.
22	From an outreach standpoint, we're
23	relatively silent until after the first of the

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1 year as well. The next major event will be the 2 MLK event, which, of course, takes place just 3 prior to the Monday that's the MLK holiday. So, 4 we'll have that Thursday event as well as the 5 Friday morning day of service, and I just want to 6 echo the attendance, if at all possible, of the 7 Commission at that event, as well as the --8 and/or that Friday morning, which is when we do 9 the community service component in Indianapolis. 10 Other events, we'll have another CLE, 11 which will conclude -- on December 11th -- which 12 will conclude our -- the series for the year, and

13 that last one will take place in Evansville,

14 Indiana.

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And I will make one more mention, of course, from an outreach standpoint, we've made

- 17 it our business to partner with as many
- 18 organizations as we can. One of the newly
- 19 founded partners is that of UNCF, and through
- 20 that partnership, what we do is we try to
- 21 leverage some of their constituents and some of
- 22 the outreach things that they're currently doing.
- 23 So, they're in a lot of the inner city

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- 1 schools throughout the state, and as they go into
- 2 some of those schools to educate the students,
- 3 the teachers and so on, and parents, about some
- 4 of the things that UNCF does, by way of our
- 5 partnership, we are also able to go in and talk
- 6 about some of the things that the ICRC has going
- 7 on as well. So, we're extremely excited about
- 8 that.

- 9 CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: Was it your
- 10 understanding that what we would do in the
- 11 partnership is take what they are doing and make
- 12 it part of our --
- 13 MR. SMITH: Yes. So, their ultimate,
- 14 I think, objective is to educate folks on UNCF,
- 15 right, some of the scholarship opportunities they
- 16 may have, some of the college opportunities they
- 17 have for students. The nature of the partnership
- 18 allows us to travel with them, if you will, so
- 19 that we don't have to reinvent the event or the
- 20 program, but we can just kind of piggy-back.
- 21 So, where they'll have a college fair --

- for example, we did one in Gary with them about a
- 23 month and a half ago, and they had upwards of

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- 1 eight to nine hundred students there, all from
- 2 Lake County, mainly black and Latino students,
- 3 but we were able to set up shop in a booth and
- 4 talk about some of the things that ICRC has going
- 5 on with some of the parents there.
- 6 And I think the message in that arena for
- 7 us is not necessarily equal employment or fair
- 8 housing, but a lot more to do with some of the
- 9 educational rights that the kids have, right, you
- 10 know, living in Indiana and having school choice
- 11 as an idea, the idea that they have the right to
- 12 ensure, as a parent, that their kid has equal
- 13 access to a quality education.
- 14 But within that process, things like, you
- 15 know, suspension and expulsion, which affects
- 16 minority kids at a disproportionate rate, and
- 17 what that means as a parent. If the child has --
- 18 especially if they have -- they're special ed or
- 19 have special needs, the idea of having due
- 20 process and what that means. And so, we're able
- 21 to educate some of the audience on that.
- 22 And because of the partnership, it gives
- 23 us the freedom to not have to do a lot of the

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1 legwork in terms of creating the event, but still 2 having the opportunity to go in and deliver the 3 message. And they have a respectable brand, and 4 so, you know, I feel comfortable in partnering 5 with them, knowing that, you know, the event that 6 they will be putting on will be legitimate, so 7 that's always a concern when, you know, we're 8 considering partnerships. 9 CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: That's great. 10 Thank you. 11 MR. SMITH: Yes, ma'am. 12 Any other questions, thoughts or concerns? 13 (No response.) 14 MR. SMITH: I will save the 15 transition conversation for the December Commission meeting.
