- The total admissions for adult males appear to have returned to normal levels for May 2007. April's numbers demonstrated a significant decrease (23%) in adult male admissions from the previous month. However, there were 1,389 total adult male admissions in May, which is a 27% increase from the April outlier of 1,109, but only a 2% difference from the March adult male admission number (1,423).

Graphs B & C

- Graph B demonstrates a slight decrease in the daily average of adult female offenders when county jail "back ups" and contracted beds are excluded from the population number. While the decrease is insignificant, it creates a noticeable trend difference from all previous months where the inclusion and exclusion graphs have remained relatively parallel.
 - This phenomenon is potentially explained in Graph C by the relatively larger number of adult females held in county jails during the second half of the month of May.

Graphs G & H

- There appears to be a continual upward trend in juvenile female and male average daily committed offender populations. While record low numbers of incarcerated juveniles were witnessed in early to mid 2006, the numbers appear to be steadily increasing for both populations. Incarcerated juvenile females has increased 24% from the beginning of fiscal year 2007 to present and the incarcerated juvenile male population has increased 16% from the beginning of fiscal year 2007.
