

Executive Summary

Beginning May, 2014, the IDOC Offender Population Statistical Report includes the addition of *Table 20* which reports juvenile parole within the newly implemented *Reintegration Districts*. Below are details concerning this new initiative:

The Division of Youth Services implemented six (6) new positions in April 2014. The JDAI Liaison/Reintegration Specialist works in a specific region of the state (see attached map). They will maintain a caseload of youth released from IDOC onto community supervision (parole) to assist with the coordination of re-entry services aimed at successful transition back into the community. The JDAI Liaison/Reintegration Specialist is a critical position for the success of the Indiana JDAI Statewide Expansion initiative, specifically related to deep-end system reform. The JDAI Liaison/Reintegration Specialist is responsible for working directly with local juvenile justice agencies, court representatives, and community corrections agents to assist in diverting youth from commitment to the Indiana Department of Correction.

The Juvenile Detention Alternatives Initiative (JDAI) is a nationally recognized juvenile justice continuous improvement program, focused on effective case processing, use of data in decision-making, reducing the placement of youth in detention, increasing alternative to detention programs, improving conditions of confinement, and reduction of youth in out-of-home dispositional placement. Indiana has adopted the JDAI philosophy and has developed a statewide expansion initiative, in partnership with the Indiana Department of Correction, Division of Youth Services, the Indiana Supreme Court, and the Indiana Criminal Justice Institute.

Definitions

For the purpose of this report, the following definitions apply:

<u>Admission</u> – The means by which an offender enters the custody or jurisdiction of the Indiana Department of Correction. For this report, with the exception of the return of an escapee, this does not include a return from a temporary absence.

<u>Average Daily Population</u> – The sum of the daily beginning counts for a month, divided by that month's number of daily beginning counts.

<u>Beginning Count</u> – The number of offenders physically present at the beginning of the day (ie, 0000:01 hours). <u>**Class A Felony**</u> – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of thirty years, with not more than twenty years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than ten years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

<u>Class B Felony</u> – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of ten years, with not more than ten years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than four years sub-tracted for mitigating circumstances.

<u>**Class C Felony**</u> – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of four years, with not more than four years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than two years sub-tracted for mitigating circumstances.

<u>Class D Felony</u> – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of one and one-half years, with not more than one and one-half years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than one year subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

<u>County Jail "Back-ups" (Jail Bed Count)</u> – Those offenders who have been committed to the Indiana Department of Correction, but are housed in a county jail until they can be transferred to a Department of Correction intake facility. The county receives \$35.00 per day, per offender, to house these offenders.

Ending Count – The number of offenders physically present at the end of the day (ie, 2400:00 hours).

<u>Felon</u> – A person convicted in any jurisdiction who might have been imprisoned for more than one year. <u>Level 1 Security Classification</u> – Minimum security level. Facilities which are designated as Level 1 have the least restrictive security measures in place.

Level 2 Security Classification – Medium security level. Facilities which are designated as Level 2 have a moderate degree of security measures in place.

<u>Level 3 Security Classification</u> – Maximum security level. Facilities which are designated as Level 3 have very restrictive security measures in place.

 $\underline{\text{Misdemeanant}}$ – A person convicted in any jurisdiction who might have been imprisoned for not more than one year.

<u>Murder</u> - An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of fifty-five years, with not more than ten years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than ten years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

<u>Operational Capacity</u> – The total bed capacity of the facility. The capacity of a facility is the number of beds authorized for safe and efficient operation of the facility.

<u>**Pre-Dispositional**</u> – An individual ordered by the Court to the Indiana Department of Correction for evaluation prior to sentencing.

<u>Recommitment</u> – When an offender returns to IDOC after having served all or some of a sentence unrelated to the current sentence.

<u>**Release**</u> – The means by which an offender leaves the custody or jurisdiction of the Indiana Department of Correction. For this report, with the exception of an escape, this does not include a temporary absence.

<u>Safekeeper</u> – An individual whom the Court has determined to be in imminent danger of serious bodily injury or death, or who represents a substantial threat to the safety of others, and whom the Court has ordered to the Indiana Department of Correction for custody and security control.

<u>Secure Confinement Units</u> – Denotes maximum control with the most restrictive security measures in place. <u>Vacancy</u> – The number of beds available for assignment.

Indiana Department of Correction Population Summary

- There were 26,645 adult male offenders (including 1,137 county jail "back-ups" and 254 in contracted beds) on June 1, 2014. This population is 2% below operational bed capacity for general population.
- There were 2,915 adult female offenders (including 178 county jail "back-ups" and 106 in contracted beds) on June 1, 2014. This population is 4% below the operational bed capacity.
- There were 372 juvenile male offenders in the Department's facilities on June 1, 2014. This population is 49% below the operational bed capacity.
- There were 43 juvenile female offenders in the Department's facilities on June 1, 2014. This population is 73% below the operational bed capacity.
- There were 8,600 adult males on parole in Indiana (7,996 Indiana parolees and 604 other jurisdiction parolees) on June 1, 2014.
- There were 1,117 adult females on parole in Indiana (1,033 Indiana parolees and 84 other jurisdiction parolees) on June 1, 2014.
- There were 1,517 adults admitted to IDOC (1,249 male and 268 female) and 1,597 adults released from IDOC (1,353 male and 244 female) in May 2014.
- There were 63 juveniles admitted to IDOC (51 male and 12 female) and 66 juveniles released from IDOC (53 male and 13 female) in May 2014.
















