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## GAS BILLS TO DRECREASE FOR CUSTOMERS OF OHIO VALLEY GAS CORPORATION

Today, in Cause No. 37354-GCA 77, the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission approved an order setting the gas cost adjustment for customers of the Ohio Valley Gas Corporation for the months of February, March, and April 2003. Customers should see lower bills.

Ohio Valley Gas provides service to the public in Connersville, Everton, Lyonsville, Springersville, and rural areas of Fayette County; Clinton Corners, Negangard Corner, Penntown, Sunman, and rural areas in Ripley County; rural areas in Franklin County; Brownsville, Liberty, and rural areas in Union County; Cannelton, St. Marks, Tell City, Troy, and rural areas in Perry County; Dover, Guilford, Lawrenceville, Logan, New Alsace, St. Leon, Yorkville, and rural areas in Dearborn County; and rural areas of eastern Spencer County west of Troy; all in Indiana.
