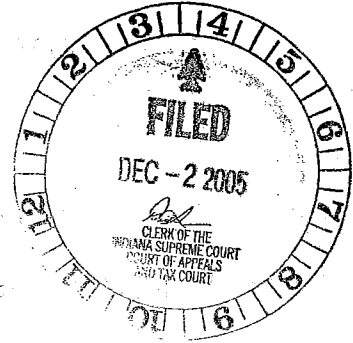

**ORDER INCREASING SENIOR JUDGE SERVICE DAYS
FOR THE CARROLL CIRCUIT COURT**

The presiding judge of the Carroll Circuit Court has requested an increase in senior judge service days.

This Court adopted revisions to Administrative Rule 5 on December 3, 2003, which made certain changes to the senior judge program in recognition of the importance of senior judges to the administration of justice in Indiana trial courts. Accordingly, we find that the Carroll Circuit Court has demonstrated the need for additional judicial resources based on the circumstances presented by that court, and would benefit from additional senior judge service days to assist with conflicts currently encountered by the newly appointed judge of that court. This Court may re-examine this increase at a later date in light of weighted caseload statistics and other circumstances, and make adjustments accordingly.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that the allocation of senior judge service days for the Carroll Circuit Court be increased to forty (40) days, to be utilized at the discretion of the presiding judge of the Carroll Circuit Court for the calendar year 2005.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the allocation of senior judge service days for the Carroll Circuit Court be increased to a total of twenty-five (25) days available to that court in the calendar year 2006.

The Clerk of this Court is directed to forward a certified copy of this order to the Honorable Don Currie, presiding judge of the Carroll Circuit Court; to the clerk of the Carroll Circuit Court, for entry in the Record of Judgments and Orders; to the Indiana Judicial Center; to the Judicial Qualifications Commission; and to the Division of State Court Administration, Payroll Section.
